Lesson 1: "Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy"

Objective: Explore staccato articulation and phrasing.

- **Listening Assignment**: Analyze the use of staccato and dynamics in "Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy."
- **Activity**: Discuss the celesta and its unique role in the orchestra. Students can compare recordings of the piece to different instrumentations.
- Piano Practice: Play simple staccato melodies, focusing on crisp articulation.
- Analysis: Discuss how the lightness of the staccato creates a magical feel.
- **Wrap-up**: Reflect on how different articulations impact the mood of the music.

Lesson 2: "March"

Objective: Learn about march rhythms and contrasting dynamics.

- **Listening Assignment**: Analyze the structure and form of "*March*." Students should identify where the dynamics change and why.
- Activity: Play a rhythmic exercise on the piano that mimics the march rhythm in 4/4 time.
- Piano Practice: Focus on contrasting forte and piano dynamics while playing C-G patterns.
- Analysis: Discuss how the march creates energy and momentum in the ballet.
- Wrap-up: Discuss Tchaikovsky's use of repetition and variation in the piece.

Lesson 3: "Waltz of the Flowers"

Objective: Understand the waltz form and 3/4 time signature.

- **Listening Assignment**: Identify the phrasing and how Tchaikovsky uses 3/4 time in "Waltz of the Flowers."
- Activity: Have students play a simple waltz pattern (root-chord-root) in C major.
- Piano Practice: Play a waltz in 3/4 time, emphasizing the first beat.
- Analysis: Discuss how waltz music differs from other time signatures and how it affects the flow of the dance.

• Wrap-up: Reflect on how the waltz makes the listener feel and why it's a central theme in the ballet.

Lesson 4: "Russian Dance (Trepak)"

Objective: Explore tempo changes and the role of accents in fast music.

- **Listening Assignment**: Listen to "Russian Dance" and discuss how the tempo and accents create excitement.
- **Activity**: Perform a rhythmic clapping exercise focusing on accents.
- **Piano Practice**: Play quick, accented passages, focusing on maintaining rhythm at higher speeds.
- Analysis: Discuss how Tchaikovsky uses tempo and dynamics to build energy in this piece.
- Wrap-up: Consider how speed and rhythmic variation convey different emotions in music.

Lesson 5: "Arabian Dance"

Objective: Explore legato phrasing, slow tempos, and mood creation.

- **Listening Assignment**: Listen to "Arabian Dance" and discuss how the legato phrasing contributes to its exotic, mysterious atmosphere.
- Activity: Work on slow, smooth legato playing, focusing on transitions between notes.
- **Piano Practice**: Practice playing scales or simple melodies legato, focusing on creating a smooth connection between notes.
- Analysis: Discuss how Tchaikovsky uses orchestration and rhythm to convey a different cultural feel.
- Wrap-up: Reflect on how different tempos and articulations impact the mood and style of a piece.

This version encourages deeper musical analysis and technique development for older students, along with a focus on how different musical elements shape the character of each piece.
